## Ffynonellau arian eraill

Mae nifer o ffyrdd eraill o wneud arian ar gyfer y grŵp, yn ogystal ag ymgeisio am grantiau:

1. **Codi arian** – os fyddwch yn cynnal sioe ffasiynau, codwch dâl am docynnau a pheidiwch ag ofni gwneud **elw!** Cyn belled ag y bo eich digwyddiad wedi'i drefnu'n dda a bod pobl yn mwynhau, fe fyddant yn ddigon parod i dalu. Mewn gwirionedd, mae'n ffordd o sicrhau presenoldeb pobl sydd wedi addo dod, gan eu bod wedi talu am eu tocynnau!

Syniadau codi arian cymunedol:

- **Ffair Masnach Deg** (codwch dâl am fynediad ac am luniaeth)
- Brecwast/ Bore Coffi Masnach Deg
- Noson **caws lleol a gwin** Masnach Deg
- Sioe Ffasiwn
- Picnic Mawr Masnach Deg
- Raffl gyda **gwobrau wedi'u cyfrannu** gan fusnesau lleol
- Pryd bwyd Masnach Deg (gofynnwch i fwyty lleol cefnogol greu bwydlen am bris penodol ac ychwanegwch £5 y person fel cyfraniad i'r grŵp)

## 2. Sicrhewch

**gefnogaeth busnesau lleol** – gall hyn fod naill ai yn ariannol neu mewn da. Mae busnesau lleol yn aml yn barod i gefnogi mentrau lleol drwy noddi digwyddiadau lleol, rhoi gwobrau neu gynnig eu gwasanaethau am ddim (costau argraffu, llogi lleoliad). Yn gyffredinol bydd modd i reolwr archfarchnad leol roi nwyddau mewn da hyd at £50 i gefnogi digwyddiadau lleol.

Wrth fynd at fusnesau lleol, mae angen ystyried yn gyntaf pwy fyddai'r person cyswllt gorau – efallai'r rheolwr os yw'n fusnes mwy neu'r perchennog os yw'n fusnes llai. Gallech roi galwad iddynt er mwyn trafod eich argymhellion yn anffurfiol ac yna anfon llythyr yn amlinellu'ch cynnig – gan gynnwys manylion am bwysigrwydd Masnach Deg a chynllun Tref Masnach Deg a'r ffordd y byddai eu cymorth yn **gwneud gwahaniaeth**.

## Finding funding...

Finding funding for your **Fairtrade Town** campaign can seem like a bit of an impossible, not to mention time consuming, task. However it isn't always as bad as it seems. There are quite a few mini grants available that don't require more than a page long application but would help turn your brilliant ideas into action. This factsheet will provide an overview of where to look for funding and other money making ideas. Follow the links to get more detailed information.

## Looking for Funding

First stop should be your **local voluntary bureau**. In general they will be able to offer information, support and guidance to community groups looking for money for their group. Most importantly they will usually have a **list of local pots of money** for you to access.

**Awards for All** – grants from £500 to £5000 for local groups, awarded throughout the year. The application form is **short and simple** and you will be told if you have been successful within 12 weeks. To apply or find out more visit

## How to write a grant

The most important thing is to make sure that your Fair Trade group is set up properly with a [constitution](#) and [bank account](#). Then check that your application meets the **criteria** of the funder. Once this is established then you can find a wealth of knowledge on how to write a good bid for funding on the internet.

## Other pots of money

There are lots more ways of making money for the group, beyond applying for grants:

1. **Earn money**- if you put on a fashion show then charge for the ticket and don't be afraid of making a **profit!** As long as your event is well organised and enjoyable people won't mind paying to come along. In fact often it ensures that people who said they will come along, do actually turn up, as they've paid!

Ideas for community fundraising ideas:

- **Fair Trade Fair** (charge a small entrance fee and make money on refreshments)
- Fairtrade breakfasts/ Coffee mornings
- Fairtrade **wine and local cheese** evening
- Fashion shows
- The Big Fairtrade Picnic
- Raffles with **donated prizes** from local businesses
- Fairtrade evening meal (ask a local supportive restaurant to create a set price menu then add on £5 per person as a contribution to the group)

2. Enlist the **support of local businesses** – this can mean either financially or in kind. Local businesses often are willing to support local initiatives by sponsoring local events, giving prizes or offering their services for free (printing costs, venue hire). In general the manager of local supermarkets will be able to give goods in kind of up to £50 so support local events.

To approach local businesses, first find out the best contact person- it might be the manager if it's a larger business or the owner if it's a smaller business. You could then give them a ring to talk through your proposal informally and finally follow it up with a letter outlining your proposal- include details of why Fair Trade and the Fairtrade Town scheme is important and how their help would **make a difference**.
